

MMC Updated visitation policy effective: Wednesday, May 26th 2021

Our policy previously allowed one healthy, masked, designated visitor to many of our inpatient units. Now, that visitor can change. For instance, a patient's spouse can visit in the afternoon, and a patient's sister can visit in the evening. Please note: only one masked visitor may be present at a time.

All visitors, including support people, are expected to:

- Present valid identification when entering the hospital and be over the age of 18.
- Accept a Coronavirus screening and not be experiencing symptoms such as cough, fever, or shortness of breath.
- Wear an appropriate mask at all times. Gators or Bandannas are not appropriate. Please bring your own, or one will be provided. Mask must cover nose and mouth.
- Stay within designated areas — either the patient's room or specific waiting areas.
- Make other arrangements for meals and drinks — the cafeteria is closed to visitors.

Emergency department

- One healthy, masked, designated visitor at a time, is allowed.
- Note: If patient or visitor volumes prevent proper social distancing, changes may be made.

ICU

- One healthy, masked, designated visitor at a time from 12pm-2pm and 3pm-5pm.
- If the patient has Covid, the visitor will need to sign a waiver, and be assisted with proper donning/doffing of PPE.

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- One healthy, masked, designated visitor at a time from the hours of 1pm-5pm.
- If the patient has Covid, the visitor will need to sign a waiver, and be assisted with proper donning/doffing of PPE.

2N and 3N: One healthy, masked, designated visitor at a time from the hours of 3pm-8pm.

New Life and Pediatrics: 2 healthy, masked, designated visitors at a time. Only one visitor may stay overnight.

TCU: visitation is dependent upon the Covid Positivity Rates.

Stepping Stones: No Visitation at this time.

IPMH: One healthy, masked, designated visitor from 6pm-7pm.

Vendors/Sales Reps are still not permitted. If education needs to happen, a Zoom meeting should be utilized. **Construction/Contractors** need to wear appropriate masks while inside hospital facilities. Gators/Bandannas are not permitted.

And as always, we adhere to Federal and State Laws. Making appropriate accommodations for an attendant, caregiver, or family member of a patient who has an intellectual, developmental, or cognitive disability, communication barrier, or behavioral concerns.

End of Life patients will continue to be permitted appropriate visitation, as coordinated through the Care Team.
